

A US veteran, husband, father, and first generation college graduate, he's now pursuing a doctoral degree in Educational Leadership. We were ready to help this family meet an educational dream, and equally ready to be there for those suffering terrible hardships. We were also there this year for a US Park Service employee who had to take leave without pay to care for a child undergoing an organ transplant and needed an emergency loan. I can't tell you how often we hear from our loan recipients, "I've never been behind on my rent before."

I'm continually moved by the FEEA community: those who bring their personal best to their federal service every day, even when met with personal hardship, and those individuals and institutions that come together to support them in their time of need.

We have a lot planned for the year ahead. We're working to get the word out to more feds about who we are and how they can get involved. We're looking at how we can provide our program beneficiaries more information and resources to support them with their higher education, disaster preparedness, and financial challenges.

REMEMBERING THOSE WE LOST

on the 15th Anniversary of September 11th

On September 12, 2001, the day after the deadliest terrorist attacks in US history, FEEA was asked to join the Pentagon Family Assistance Center to help those families stricken with horrific loss and pain. FEEA staff reported every day for a month to the Center, helping families make travel arrangements to bring loved ones to town, arranging funerals, helping make household bill payments on time, and providing emotional support. After meeting the most immediate and urgent needs, FEEA's board of directors decided to establish a college scholarship fund for those children who lost a parent in the Pentagon attack.

2016 was the 15th anniversary of the deadly attacks of September 11. To date, FEEA has supported over 50 children and is working with and will continue to work with several families who had infants and small children at the time of the attack.

With the support of numerous individuals and businesses including General Dynamics, the Motorola Foundation, Lockheed Martin, Northup Grumman, and the Nike Foundation, we have helped make college a reality for these families. We are seeing proud young teachers, doctors, lawyers, and other professionals emerge from this program. At FEEA we remember their parents and are grateful for their service.







THIS IS LISA

Lisa is a GS 8 employee* Lisa was a victim of domestic violence. Her agency approved a transfer to another state so she could get herself and her children to safety. FEEA was there to support her with a no-interest loan so she could cover her new rent payment when her moving expenses were piling up.

Hardships can strike any family. And when they do, many families are left with scary financial choices like taking on high interest credit card or payday loan debt, or missing rent or mortgage payments and risking eviction. And with over half a million federal employees earning less than \$50,000 a year, hardships like illness, the death of a family member, a spouse's

layoff from work, or a home fire can really derail a fed. That's where FEEA comes in. We offer no-interest, no-fee, confidential loans to feds that are paid back via payroll allotment. In 2016, FEEA gave 850 loans to families totaling over \$700,000. We never want to see the lack of one month's rent lead a family toward bankruptcy.

THIS IS JAKE

Jake is a US postal worker. This year, his home was devastated by the floods that wreaked havoc across the Gulf States. He had over \$60,000 worth of damage and loss of property. FEEA was there to help Jake with a grant to help get him back into his home and offset some of his losses.

Natural disasters strike each and every year all across the United States. The President often declares close to 100 natural disasters each year in response to floods, hurricanes, winter storms, wildfires, droughts, and tornadoes. FEEA provides disaster relief grants to individual federal families

whose home was completely destroyed or left largely uninhabitable as a result of a major natural disaster. We help offset extensive repairs so feds can get back into their homes and sometimes offset the cost of temporary lodging while they are out of their homes.

MAKING SAFE, QUALITY **CHILDCARE AFFORDABLE**

The cost of childcare often represents a significant portion of an employee's take-home pay. This is especially true for those with lower incomes.

Beginning in 2001, FEEA, and later its wholly-owned subsidiary, FEEA Childcare Services Inc., began partnering with agencies across the US government to design and implement a childcare subsidy program for lower income federal employees. This Congressionally-authorized program puts quality childcare in families' financial grasp.
